About Arab Barometer

The Arab Barometer is a nonpartisan research network that provides insights into the social, political, and economic attitudes and values of ordinary citizens across the Arab world.

We have been conducting high-quality and reliable public opinion surveys of probability samples representative of citizens aged 18 or above in the Middle East and North Africa since 2006. Our surveys contain up to 2,400 respondents in each country. Interviews were conducted face-to-face in the respondent's place of residence. The error margin is ± 3 percent.

The Arab Barometer is the largest repository of publicly available data on the views of men and women in the MENA region. Our findings give a voice to the needs and concerns of Arab publics.

Through 2019, the Arab Barometer has conducted 49 national surveys over five waves including more than 74,000 interviews in 14 Arab countries.
